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Haitian president pledges to outlast troubles

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — Haiti's president says he will serve out his term despite rising violence, poor economic performance and months of

protests over unresolved allegations of corruption in his predecessor's administration.

President Jovenel Moise pledged in an interview with The Associated Press on Wednesday (August 29) to respect the findings of a commission investigating the corruption allegations.

"It takes a lot of courage to stay in power, but I am pledging to you to have the courage to continue moving forward," Moise said, saying he would resist pressure to resign.

Companies belonging to Moise were named in two reports, by a federal auditor and the Haitian senate, into the spending of funds from Petrocaribe, a Venezuelan government program that provided subsidized oil to Caribbean nations. Protesters have repeatedly taken to the streets in recent months in demonstrations prompted by the findings of widespread fraud in government contracts awarded to contractors to build roads, buildings and administer social programs.

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USAID Ends Haiti Food Insecurity Program

PORT-AU-PRINCE, HAITI - *Kore Lavi*, a U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) food program for malnourished Haitians, ended in August amid a worsening of Haiti's food insecurity crisis.

It is estimated that 2.6 million people, roughly a quarter of Haiti's population, faces food insecurity in 2019. Experts say natural disasters, high inflation and the country's socio-political and economic problems are to blame.

"*Kore Lavi* has served as a strong model in the ongoing development of Haiti's National Social Protection Policy," Alexis Barnes, acting senior development, outreach and communications officer for USAID in Port-au-Prince, told VOA via email.

"This activity was designed to be a partnership with the government of Haiti that would model through a limited sample of households a predictable, social transfer focused on consumption of nutritious foods among the most vulnerable in 21 communes," Barnes said.

New way to address hunger

The multimillion-dollar program began in 2013. It provided nutritious meals to 18,000 households in the southeast, northwest, central plateau and Artibonite regions, as well as the Isle of La Gonave.

Originally scheduled to end in September 2017, USAID extended the program for two more years after Hurricane Matthew in 2016, which devastated homes and food crops in many regions of the Caribbean country.

Four NGOs — the World Food Program (WFP), World Vision, Action Against Hunger and CARE — administered the program with MAST, Haiti's Ministry of Public Works and

Social Affairs (Ministere des Affaires Sociales et du Travail Haitien).

Program coordinator Laureore Antoine said organizers used innovative ways to address hunger.

"We wanted to divorce ourselves from the traditional approach," Antoine, a Haitian official with CARE, a Geneva-based international humanitarian and international development agency, told VOA. "We wanted to kill two birds with one stone, so we boosted local production, as well."

That new approach included "fresh products" such as meat, fish and vegetables sold by program-approved vendors.

"That way the beneficiary was able to consume a nutritionally balanced meal and learn the components of that. But what's more important is that we achieved this with a network of local vendors whom we found living in the community - in many cases they were women - in fact 86 percent of our local vendors were women," he said.

Kore Lavi participants received a monthly allotment of food stamps that could be used to buy perishable provisions for the week. Vendors then turned in the vouchers for cash.

Government solutions

Haitian opposition lawmaker Youri

Latortue, who owns a poultry farm, said boosting national food production is key. He fears Haiti's food insecurity will soon worsen if that doesn't happen.

"When you have 3 million people who don't have access to food on a daily basis, you are heading towards famine," he told VOA's Creole Service. "It's not normal to depend on international aid agencies to feed the people. Of course it's true that it is a humanitarian situation (crisis) that they can temporarily assist us with, but it's not a permanent solution. The (Haitian) government needs to step in to do its part."

Latortue said the government solution for the current crisis must include all sectors of the food production industry, both livestock and agriculture.

"That's the only way out of this crisis," he said.

As *Kore Lavi* shuts its operations, Barnes is satisfied with the program's accomplishments.

"Achievements include the development of the SIMAST vulnerability mapping system, which has now expanded and is supported by other donors such as the European Union, and international NGOs working on activities serving the most vulnerable," she said.

Barnes expressed optimism that the

Haitian government will keep the progress going.

"The program succeeded in demonstrating that the government of Haiti can manage a predictable social transfer activity to the most vulnerable in this country in a well-targeted and transparent manner," she said. "Haiti's commitment to developing the policy framework for engagement of a durable and manageable social protection system is essential to this task, and we have been proud to support our government counterparts as they vision and structure their system."

Looking forward

Does that mean the beneficiaries will maintain the level of nutrition they achieved over six years?

"The people still have problems," Antoine acknowledged. He said things will indeed change. MAST needs access to financial resources so they can continue funding the program, he said.

Antoine hopes a micro-loan system CARE put in place to support the food program will motivate former participants to unite and borrow money to launch small businesses that can pick up where *Kore Lavi* left off.

"Recently, we did a resilience study using a methodology called SenseMaker, where we asked the beneficiaries to tell us how they are living, how the program changed their lives. We can tell you that (the program) required a huge effort, a lot of sacrifices, but in the end, we delivered (what we promised). So today, as we participate in the official closing ceremony, we stand proud of our work with the most vulnerable populations," Antoine said.

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Haiti's President Survives Impeachment Vote

WASHINGTON/PORT-AU-PRINCE, HAITI - Haiti's President Jovenel Moise has survived an impeachment vote in parliament, ending a weeklong push by opposition parties to unseat him over corruption and other criminal allegations.

In a marathon session that began late Wednesday and ended in the early hours of Thursday, the president survived when 53 of the 61 lawmakers present voted the impeachment measure down. Three deputies who were present voted for impeachment, and five others abstained. The remaining 58 lawmakers out of the 119-member body were not present, however the vote proceeded according to the country's parliamentary system.

it. We're not playing." Protesters said they would be waiting until the early hours of the morning if necessary to see how they would vote.

"Everything must happen where the people can see (with transparency)," a female protester told VOA, "because we the people voted them in."

Bodeau told VOA he was considering opening up a dialogue with members of the opposition as early as Thursday. He said the next order of business would be examining the prime minister nominee's dossier.

The president has not yet publicly commented on the decision.

Opposition deputies have accused Moise of numerous constitutional violations. Among them — naming unqualified citizens to cabinet positions and signing contracts with foreign companies not approved by the government institution that oversees such matters.

The opposition's insistence on prioritizing the impeachment vote before dealing with any other matters before the chamber held up a vote on the nominated prime minister, Fritz William Michel. Haiti has been without a prime minister since March, when Jean Henry Ceant was forced to resign after a no

confidence vote.

VOA Creole spoke to Deputy Gary Bodeau, president of the Chamber of Deputies, shortly after the marathon session ended.

"I'm not thrilled, because this is not how I wanted the debate to proceed," Bodeau said. "There are arguments I read in the impeachment indictment that seemed to have merit. Unfortunately, the deputies did not remain in the chamber to debate the accusation, and that's why the session ended. It's very unfortunate."

Majority PHTK Party deputy, Moise Michel, told VOA he was satisfied with

the outcome.

"This is the only democracy where the minority group tries to lay down the law. In all other democracies (of the world), it's the majority party that does that. Whether or not they agree, the debate happened. We respected their constitutional right to ask for an impeachment vote, and you saw how they tried to block and obstruct the vote so it wouldn't happen," Michel told VOA.

Ahead of the impeachment vote, protesters had camped out in front of the parliament building holding signs that read, "Haiti is Not for Sale, Lock Up the Thieves." Protesters also told VOA they wanted Bodeau to "watch

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Trump's personal assistant fired after comments about Ivanka, Tiffany

Madeleine Westerhout, who left her White House job suddenly on Thursday as President Trump's personal assistant, was fired after bragging to reporters that she had a better relationship with Trump than his own daughters, Ivanka and Tiffany Trump, and that the president did not like being in pictures with Tiffany because he perceived her as overweight.



Westerhout also jokingly told the journalists that Trump couldn't pick Tiffany out of a crowd, said one of the people. "She had a couple drinks and in an uncharacteristically unguarded moment, she opened up to the reporters," the person said.

At some point, Gidley left the restaurant for a television interview on Fox News. During that time -- around 45 minutes to an hour -- Westerhout made the comments to the reporters.

After the Aug. 17 dinner, which took place at the restaurant inside the nearby Embassy Suites hotel and included the Washington Post's Phil Rucker, Bloomberg's Jennifer Jacobs, Reuters' Steve Holland and the Wall Street Journal's Andrew Restuccia, Westerhout rode back to a different hotel, the Marriott, with Rucker and Holland.

White House staffers having off-the-record dinners or drinks with reporters has long been a commonplace practice when a president is traveling.

Given Westerhout's sensitive role as a confidante to the president, the few details the White House shared about her abrupt firing had Washington's political-media class in a quiet frenzy on Thursday night and Friday.

The critical comments happened at an off-the-record dinner, according to two people familiar with the matter, that Westerhout and deputy White House press secretary Hogan Gidley held earlier this month with reporters who were covering Trump's vacation at his golf club in Bedminster, New Jersey.

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Le passeport haïtien sert-il à quelque chose ?

Chaque année, la compagnie Henley & Partners basée à Londres et spécialisée dans le conseil de citoyenneté et de résidence par investissement, publie un classement des passeports les plus puissants à travers le monde. Et c'est presque toujours les mêmes pays qui sont classés en tête de liste. Ainsi, en 2019, le Japon décroche la première position avec 190 accessibles, Singapour et la Corée du Sud arrivent en deuxième position avec 189 pays pouvant être visités par leurs citoyens sans visa, suivis de près par l'Allemagne et la France dont les ressortissants peuvent se rendre dans 188 sans avoir à passer par une ambassade pour demander un visa d'entrée. Presque tous les pays de l'Espace européen Schengen, ainsi que le Canada et les États-Unis complètent la liste du top 10 des passeports les plus puissants. À noter que le passeport américain arrive en 6ème position avec 185 pays accessibles directement.

Et le passeport haïtien dans tout cela ? Il décroche la peu enviable 87ème place, coincé entre le Vietnam et la Guinée-Équatoriale avec seulement 51 pays accessibles sans visa. La plupart des nations qui laissent grandes ouvertes leurs portes aux Haïtiens se trouvent en Afrique de l'Est (Éthiopie, Tanzanie, Kenya...), en Asie-du-Sud, en plus de la Turquie et de l'Ukraine. Sur le continent américain, seuls le Suriname et la Bolivie continuent à être accueillants pour les Haïtiens. Les autres pays ont les uns après les autres fermé leurs portes d'entrée, le dernier en date étant le Chili qui a décidé d'instaurer un visa pour les voyageurs haïtiens afin de limiter l'immigration clandestine qui a pris de l'ampleur ces derniers temps (voir article de l'édition du 1 novembre 2018 à ce sujet). Sans surprise, la majorité des pays développés barricadent leurs frontières face à des pays comme Haïti qu'ils considèrent comme de potentiels pourvoyeurs d'immigrants illégaux. Heureusement, il reste quelques exceptions, puisqu'Israël, la Corse-du-Sud ainsi que Singapour figurent parmi les pays développés qui ont décidé de maintenir un accès libre aux citoyens haïtiens. À l'inverse, Haïti est un des pays les plus accueillants au monde, puisque son territoire est accessible sans visa à pratiquement toutes les nationalités issues des 5 continents, à l'exception des Colombiens, Cubains, Dominicains, Palestiniens et Panaméens.

Que faire alors lorsque l'on désire aller en Europe, au Canada ou aux États-Unis pour faire du tourisme ou visiter des membres de sa famille ? Il faut passer par le consulat du pays de destination pour demander un visa d'entrée en bonne et due forme. Et là, c'est tout un parcours de combattant qui attend le citoyen haïtien. Prenons l'exemple du visa Schengen qui permet l'accès à 26 pays de l'Union européenne. Munis de votre passeport qui doit obligatoirement être biométrique, il vous faut tout d'abord prendre un rendez-vous pour déposer votre dossier. En temps de forte affluence, cela peut prendre des semaines, voire des mois. En parallèle, vous devez préparer les documents exigés prouvant que vous pouvez financer votre séjour et que vous allez revenir en Haïti par la suite. Il vous faudra donc présenter les réservations d'hôtel, mais surtout un billet d'avion aller-retour. Un investissement qui peut être aventureux sachant que le voyageur n'est pas encore certain que le visa lui sera accordé.

À cela s'ajoutent d'autres documents exigés pour compléter le dossier, à savoir une attestation de travail, sa fiche de paie, une assurance voyage, des relevés bancaires des 3 derniers mois, voire plus selon le profil du demandeur. Autant de justificatifs qui disqualifient d'office un grand nombre d'Haïtiens, surtout avec le taux de pauvreté et de chômage que connaît le pays. Pour les autres, il faut s'armer de patience et user parfois de ruses pour contourner ces barrières bureaucratiques décourageantes à plus d'un titre. Car avouons-le, les pays riches font tout pour repousser les voyageurs issus des pays en voie de développement.

Ceux qui arrivent tout de même à transmettre un dossier complet doivent ensuite attendre au minimum 10 jours, le temps que le consulat traite la demande en question. Lorsque le principal intéressé est enfin contacté pour venir retirer son passeport, ce dernier ne peut cacher son appréhension au moment où il ouvre son document de voyage pour voir s'il a réussi "l'examen de passage". Tous ces obstacles administratifs imposés par certains consulats étrangers gâchent malheureusement le plaisir des Haïtiens qui veulent juste voyager et profiter de leurs vacances normalement.

Le gouvernement quant à lui semble trainer les pieds pour négocier des conventions de libre circulation avec des nations amies. Tout juste se préoccupe-t-il des détenteurs de passeports diplomatiques ou de service qui représentent l'élite du pays. Avec autant d'entraves et de difficultés pour voyager librement à l'étranger, c'est à se demander si le passeport haïtien sert encore à quelque chose !

Le Parlement a imposé 50% du cabinet de Fritz W Michel, révèle Larèche

Sur les 18 ministres composant le nouveau cabinet ministériel, le Parlement dispose à lui seul de 9 d'entre eux ». C'est ce qu'a révélé le sénateur Ronald Larèche, quelques heures après le récent remaniement effectué au sein du gouvernement de Fritz William Michel. Ces 9 postes sont ainsi répartis : 3 pour le Sénat de la République et 6 pour la Chambre des députés.

Le sénateur Ronald Larèche l'a dit sans ambages, sans langue de bois. « Le pouvoir législatif à travers ses deux branches, a proposé neuf (9) des 18 personnalités composant la nouvelle équipe gouvernementale ». À en croire l'élu du Nord-est, le Sénat de la République contrôle les ministères de l'Éducation Nationale et de la Formation Professionnelle, du Tourisme et de la Santé publique.

« Quant à la Chambre basse, elle dispose à elle seule de six (6) ministères », informe le parlementaire. Cependant, Larèche n'était pas en mesure de dire avec exactitude le nom de ces ministères obtenus par les députés. Quels sont les blocs politiques qui ont désigné ces personnalités ? Ces sénateurs sont-ils proches ou anti-gouvernementaux ? Des questions auxquelles le parlementaire n'avaient pas pu ou voulu encore répondre.

« Je ne fais pas partie de ceux qui négocient des postes ministériels. Donc, je n'ai pas proposé ou imposé de noms comme ministre ou directeur général », a précisé Ronald Larèche. Pour le parlementaire du parti VERITE, cette démarche, ancrée désormais dans la pratique de la politique haïtienne, est tout à fait « déloyale ».

« Comment peut-on contrôler un gouvernement, lorsqu'on est partie prenante de ce même gouvernement », s'interroge perplexe l'élu du Nord-est. Ronald Larèche attend deux pieds fermes le Premier ministre Fritz William Michel et son gouvernement qui, dit-il, doivent le convaincre à voter en faveur de sa politique générale.

Plus d'un mois après sa nomination, le PM nommé Fritz William Michel et son cabinet attendent encore la tenue d'une séance de ratification. Ce jeudi 29 août, cinq (5) nouvelles têtes ont fait leur entrée au sein de l'équipe, moins de 48 heures après la démission de Marjorie Alexandre Brunache et Pradel Henriquez, respectivement au poste de Ministres des affaires étrangères et de la culture et de la communication.

L'ex Premier Ministre s'est gardé de faire des déclarations à l'issue de l'audition. Son avocat Mario Delcy a assuré que M. Lamothe est à la disposition de la justice. Au cours des dernières semaines plusieurs anciens ministres dont Jacques Roussau et Yves Germain Joseph avaient répondu aux questions du juge instructeur.

Le magistrat réalise ses investigations suite aux plaintes de plusieurs citoyens et de l'état haïtien sur les accusations de dilapidation de plus de 4 milliards de dollars américains. Les fonds ont été octroyés à Haïti dans le cadre d'un accord sur l'achat à des conditions préférentielles de produits pétroliers du Venezuela.

L'enquête administrative réalisée par la Cour Supérieure des Comptes et du Contentieux Administratif (CSCCA) a révélé des cas de dilapidation des fonds publics impliquant des officiels et des responsables d'entreprises privées. D'autres personnalités dont l'ex Premier Ministre Jean Max Bellerive ont également été convoquées par le juge Accimé.

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Several Miami-Dade, Broward Cities Handing Out Sandbags To Their Residents

MIAMI (CBSMiami) – Several cities across Miami-Dade and Broward will be handing out sandbags ahead of Hurricane Dorian.

The City of Miami Beach will distribute sandbags to Miami Beach residents Saturday August 31, from 8:00 a.m to 5:00 p.m. at the Public Works Operation Yard, which is between Miami Beach High School and Fire Station 2 on Dade Boulevard.

In Homestead, the city is distributing sandbags Friday from noon to 7 p.m at the Roby George Park and the Homestead Sports Complex.

City of Miami residents can get up to 6 sand bags Friday and from 8:00am to 8:00pm at Grapeland Park located at 1550 NW 37th Ave, and Legion Park: 6447 NE 7th Ave.

In Opa-locka, sandbags are available at the Opa-locka Public Works Department starting at 8 a.m.

In Miami Lakes, sandbags are available from noon to 10:00 p.m. or until supplies last at 16500 NW 87th Avenue.



In North Miami Beach, residents can get up to 6 sand bags starting at noon at the North Miami Beach Operations Center, located at 2101 NE 159 St (North Side).

In North Miami, sand bags (maximum of 6 per resident) will be available for at the North Miami Motor Pool, 1855 NE 142 Street, once a hurricane watch is issued.

In Miami-Dade, residents can get sand-

bags starting at 3:00 p.m. at the rear of Miami Baptist Church, 14955 SW 88th Street, until supplies run out. (Bring your own shovels and bags)

Sandbags are also available in Hialeah and Palm Springs North on Saturday, August 31 starting at 10:00 a.m. Locations are Amelia Earhart Park at 401 E 65th St, and Norman and Jean Reach Park at 7895 NW 176th St. while supplies last.

In Broward, sandbags are being distributed at Mills Pond Park in Fort Lauderdale from noon to 8 p.m.

In Dania Beach, sandbags are being distributed The Dania Beach Casino, North East Parking Lot at 6 p.m and at the NE 2nd Street entrance across the street from Saint Maurice at Resurrection Catholic Church. The city will hand out six (6) sandbags per household.

In Margate, sandbags will be available in a first-come, first-serve basis at the Margate Sports Complex through Saturday, August 31 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The City of Pompano Beach is giving out sand bags across the street from Pompano Beach Airport at 1660 NE 10th Street until supplies last.

Anyone picking up sandbags must bring an ID to prove you are a resident of these cities.

South Florida gas stations low on fuel as Hurricane Dorian nears

More than half of South Florida's gas stations are without fuel ahead of possible landfall by Hurricane Dorian, according to Gasbuddy, a group that monitors fuel shortages.

As POLITICO reported Friday, Gov. Ron DeSantis says the Florida Highway Patrol has been directed escort fuel trucks to make sure gas stations are being resupplied as efficiently as possible.

"We have a lot of fuel in Florida," DeSantis said, according to POLITICO. "We just have limited capacity to bring it from the ports to gas stations because you can only have so many trucks at one time doing that."

According to Gasbuddy's numbers at the time of posting, nearly 56 percent of gas stations in the West Palm Beach-Fort Pierce area were without fuel. For the Miami-Fort Lauderdale region, that number was more than 57 percent.

The Fort Myers-Naples and Gainesville

areas also both saw more than 50 percent of stations without gas. But those numbers weren't as high as the shortages in South Florida.

No other region tracked by GasBuddy, which worked with state officials during Hurricane Irma, saw more than 37 percent of stations without fuel.

DeSantis declared a state of emergency Wednesday. By Thursday, he had expanded that emergency declaration to cover the entire state.

The state of emergency gives the Governor and other state officials more latitude in coordinating efforts to aid with storm preparation and recovery.

The rush to refuel comes as Dorian moves closer to the Sunshine State. The latest projections have it hitting the coast east on Lake Okeechobee before turning sharply upward and moving north through the rest of Florida.

That's prompted people from a wide swath of Florida to stock up on fuel and supplies in the event of a catastrophic storm.

Dorian could be a Category 4 by the time it reaches Florida's east coast. While it would likely weaken quickly by sitting over land, it would still be more than strong enough

to create dangerous flooding conditions should it move on its projected path.

There is still significant uncertainty in the projections, however. But Florida could begin feeling the effects of the storm as early as Sunday, with a direct hit taking place Monday night.

On August 2nd, 2019 the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) published a memo stating its intention to end two parole programs: the Haitian Family Reunification Parole program and the Filipino World War II Veterans Parole program.

This action to terminate the Haitian Family Reunification Parole and the Filipino World War II Veterans Parole programs remains consistent with the Executive Order 13767, Border Security and Immigration Enforcement Improvements, signed on January 25, 2017 by Donald J Trump. Section 11 of the Executive Order dictates that, "it is the policy of the executive branch to end the abuse of parole and asylum provisions currently used to prevent the lawful removal of removable aliens." According to the Trump administration, the decision to terminate was made to ensure that the parole authority is exercised only on a case-by-case basis in accordance with the law.

As stated by the American Immigration Council, parole, under U.S. Immigration law, is granted by the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to temporarily allow noncitizens to enter the United States if they are applying for admission to the United States but do not have a legal reason or are inadmissible. Parole is only granted if the DHS decides that there are urgent humanitarian or significant public benefit reasons for an individual to enter the United States and that the person's merit, in which their positive factors outweigh the negatives, grants them favorable consideration. Urgent Humanitarian Parole is given based on time sensitivity and the degree of suffering that may follow if parole is not given, such as coming to the United States to seek protection from harm or to receive critical medical treatment. Meanwhile, public benefit parole is typically given to noncitizens in order for them to take part in a criminal or civil proceeding in the United States.

Individuals granted parole are typically expected to depart the United States when their authorized period expires; they are not provided immigration status nor are they formally admitted into the United States under immigration law. Admission occurs when a noncitizen enters the United States pursuant to a visa or another entry document without being limited by parole.

The Haitian Family Reunification Parole Program (HFRP) was created in December 2014 to allow eligible U.S. Citizens and lawful permanent residents to apply for parole for family members in earthquake-ravaged Haiti; giving them the chance to be reunited with family members approximately two years before their immi-

grant visa (green card) becomes available. To be eligible to apply to the parole program, a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident, who received an invitation from the Department of State's National Visa Center (NVC), must file a Form I-130, Petition for Alien Relative, on behalf of a Haitian family member whose immigrant visa was expected to be available approximately within 18-42 months from the date of the invitation, and have it approved on or before December 18, 2014.

The process to apply to the HFRP Program on behalf of a Haitian family member requires the petitioners to file a parole application, Form I-131 Application for Travel Document, along with the \$360 required fee or fee waiver request Form I-912, and a Form I-134, Affidavit of Support. Petitioners were given 6 months from the date of their invitation from the NVC to submit their applications.

Given the fact that the USCIS grants parole on a case by case basis, for parole to be given to the petitioner's family member, the beneficiary, an interview was required. Only family members that were interviewed in Haiti and qualified for an immigrant visa were given parole. The interview would be scheduled by the HFRP Program and notifications would be given to both the petitioner and the beneficiary.

Once in the United States, after the U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officer inspects the beneficiary, reviews their documents, and, assuming everything is in order, paroles the beneficiary into the United States. The beneficiary would then receive an electronic form I-94, Arrival/Departure Record, to document their parole in the United States. Since the program allowed for the lawful permanence of the beneficiary in the United States, they could apply for work authorization by filing the Form I-765, Application for Employment Authorization, to sustain themselves.

As previously mentioned, parole does not grant any legal immigration status, consequently HFRP beneficiaries were expected to apply for lawful permanent resident status once they had their immigrant visas. The end of this program would mean that individuals will no longer be allowed to wait in the United States for their family-based green card to become available.

According to USCIS, current parolees will keep their current period of parole until it expires, unless it is terminated beforehand, and parolees who have not adjusted status or been admitted may request parole under the non-categorical process by filing out Form I-131, Application for Travel Document (more information on applying for non-categorical parole

is available on the Humanitarian or Significant Public Benefit Parole for Individuals Outside the United States page). Moreover, USCIS states that all pending cases will be processed to completion.

As the USCIS begins the process to terminate the Haitian Family Reunification Parole program and the Filipino World War II Veterans Parole program it will continue to review all remaining categorical parole programs. No program will be terminated until required administrative changes are completed in the Form I-131 and it is approved for the public. The Paperwork Reduction Act (PRA) will notify affected individuals, provide an explanation as to why the USCIS is taking action, and provide public comment periods regarding the termination of these programs.

Former Mail Carrier Sentenced in \$2.1 Million Investment Scam

Tallahassee, Fla. – The Florida Office of Financial Regulation today announced that Lawyer Stanley, Jr., has been sentenced to eight years in prison, to be followed by 10 years of supervised release and 100 hours of community service for his role in an investment scheme that stole more than \$2.1 million from at least 36 victims. Stanley was also ordered to pay restitution to his victims.

Alex Toledo, OFR Acting Bureau Chief of Financial Investigations, said "Thank you to our investigators and part-

ners, including the Miami-Dade County State Attorney's Office, for their efforts in stopping this scam and bringing this criminal to justice. The Florida Office of Financial Regulation will continue to fight to protect Floridians from financial scams."

From 2006 to 2015,

while employed as a letter carrier for the United States Postal Service, Stanley solicited investors for a purported gold and diamonds investment opportunity in Africa mainly from residents of his mail route, but also co-workers and acquaintances. Stanley represented that he traveled to Africa to personally visit gold and diamond mines to select stones to be imported and sold in the United States. He also persuaded victims to invest in large scale infrastructure projects for which he claimed

to have exclusive con-

tracts with governments in Africa. He promised investors that he would double their investments. Instead, Stanley spent most of his victims' money on personal living expenses. 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John Morgan to Andrew Gillum: Show me my money

“He’s not registering voters, he’s promoting himself.”

He’s the lawyer with perhaps the best-known mug in America. But the ubiquitous smile turned into a scowl Wednesday.

John Morgan kicked off his lunch speech at the Capital Tiger Bay Club in Tallahassee reminiscing about the political figures he’d encountered since his student government days at the University of Florida.

Now 63, he spoke glowingly about former Governors Leroy Collins, Bob Graham, Jeb Bush and Charlie Crist.

He even acknowledged grudging respect for now-Sen. Rick Scott and former House Speaker – now Education Commissioner – Richard Corcoran.

But Morgan would spend the next 20 minutes of his talk excoriating Tallahassee’s favorite son and 2018 Democratic gubernatorial nominee Andrew Gillum.

Despite considering Gillum’s platform too far to the left and off-putting for many Floridians, Morgan and his firm reached into their deep pockets and gave the candidate \$1.7 million – then Morgan personally gave another \$250,000 after a last-minute plea for money from the campaign.

“The promise was, ‘We’re going to spend it and we’re going to win and the values that you value are going to have a chance to be leading Florida,’” Morgan said.

“He was not my first choice, he was not my second choice, he was not my third choice,” Morgan told the crowd. “When he got the nomination, here was my feeling: Wouldn’t it be awesome for an African American to be the governor of the state of Florida? I was on board with that.”

Morgan and other last-gasp donors would later learn that, after losing the election, Gillum was sitting on a \$3.7

million pile of leftover cash – and that the failed candidate wasn’t going to be giving it back.

When the powerful Orlando trial lawyer asked Gillum for his money back, Morgan said he was told “no”.

Gillum has since said he will use the money to fund a campaign to register two million new voters in Florida.

Morgan posited a different scenario.

“Andrew Gillum kept that money to promote Andrew Gillum,” Morgan said. “He’s not registering voters, he’s promoting himself ... I think he thinks he has another day in politics.

He would expand on the theme later when taking questions from the media: “This guy’s (Gillum) never had a job outside of politics. I think he’s dead on arrival.

Morgan added, “If he does decide to run again, I do believe I have a cause of action,” Morgan told the crowd of political insiders on Wednesday. “I do believe I will sue him to get that \$3.7 million back to the ones that gave at the end. I do believe that.”

Morgan also weighed in on citizen initiative campaigns to change Florida’s constitution relating to legalizing recreational marijuana and his personal quest to raise the state’s minimum wage to \$15 an hour.

While he’s all for allowing people to use and grow marijuana, Morgan said he’ll leave the financing of the process to others in the 2020 election cycle.

Medical marijuana was approved by more than 71 percent of voters in 2016 thanks to a campaign largely bankrolled by Morgan. He spent about \$4 million of his and his law firm’s money backing that amendment.

He said he is currently awaiting his state-approved card to purchase cannabis, and got one of the biggest laughs of the day when he explained to a doctor why he had PTSD, even though he wasn’t a service member or first responder.

“F***ing Donald Trump is the president of the United States of America,” he wisecracked. “How the hell do you think I got PTSD?”

(Actually, Morgan’s biggest laugh

came while he was riffing about random people thanking him for his marijuana legalization efforts, including a shirtless fellow he met while walking the beach – he was also shirtless. “Willie from Georgia” insisted on a hug, which Morgan likened to a “wet bird nest on my shoulder.”)

But Morgan was serious when talking about his “last crusade”: Getting a constitutional amendment approved that would incrementally raise the minimum wage in Florida by a dollar a year until it reaches \$15 an hour.

“I’m 63 years old. I’m most likely in my last quarter. When you get to this age you start to think less about success and more about significance,” he told the group.

Morgan spoke of his family being “poor, very poor” when he was a child and said he thinks many people who voted for Trump in the last presidential election live lives of “quiet desperation.”

“They live in quicksand,” he said.

No matter how hard they swim, they finally get out and they slide back in – the transmission goes out, the radiator goes out, the AC goes out (and) they slide back in.”

Harkening to his Christian religious training, Morgan said “love thy neighbor” is one of the greatest commandments and that ethical concerns should overshadow economics.

“I’ll pay 50 cents more for a hamburger. Won’t you?” he asked. “When I gave all the people in my firm \$15 an hour raises last year, it was palpable. People were sobbing. People were crying. It is life-changing.”

Finally, after the event, Gillum tweeted his reaction to Morgan’s comments: *When keeping my name in your mouth makes you relevant...*

Moïse was described as receiving potentially improper payments as a private contractor to build a road in northern Haiti before he became president.

The audits revealed millions of dollars of aid money siphoned off by contractors for shoddy and substandard work, like an overpass built over busy Delmas avenue that cost about \$23 million, but should have cost around \$16 million.

Once revealed, the extent of the cor-

ruption sparked widespread protests and street violence, and calls for Moïse to step down.

Moïse has refused to resign, though he promised to criminally charge anyone found by the audit board to have stolen funds from the government.

“Of course we must know the truth and the truth about this investigation must be released. That is very important. The investigation must reveal the truth so that justice can be served and the guilty jailed. Those who misspent the government’s

money, they should be arrested and locked up,” Moïse said Wednesday.

The protests, economic downturn and increasing insecurity and gang-related crime have made Moïse’s political future uncertain despite his determination to stay in power.

Moïse said he was not concerned about more allegations of his involvement in potentially improper contracting, saying: “The judicial audit does not involve the executive branch. This is a concern of the judicial branch.”

The president insisted that Haiti must move beyond the crisis and let the judicial process play out.

“We must go beyond talking about the survival of the government, because political stability in Haiti is the most important thing for us,” he said. “If the opposition wants power they must participate in democratic elections and win the vote of the people.”

who initially came up with the idea to start this charitable organization three years ago after witnessing firsthand the inadequate health conditions and sanitation systems and lack of access to proper healthcare in Haiti's northern region while volunteering as a trainer for the Haiti Project of the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine's Department of Family Medicine and Community Health in 'Hopital Université Justinien'.

The establishment of the Haiti Project was founded in 1998 by a cadre of department faculty including Drs. Michel Dodard, André Vulcain and Arthur Fournier. The initiative is a University of Miami unique partnership with the Ministry of Health of Haiti and L'Hôpital Universitaire Justinien of the city of Cap-Haitien, which is the main referral hospital for the North Health Department serving over 800,000 people.

While the curriculum developed remained faithful to the tenets of family medicine – with an emphasis on ambulatory care, continuity of care and a bio-psychosocial approach- provisions were allowed to equip trainees to address the Haitian health challenges. After only ten years of operation, the teaching program was staffed with Haitian physicians, fully trained in Family Medicine.

Through that partnership, experienced physicians from Miami have been trained Haitian medical school graduates in many health fields as they deliver much-needed services to Haiti's rural areas. Well into 2019, the project has implemented educational and health care services and trained more than 100 family physicians.

While the Haiti Project has been focusing on training Haitian medical school graduates for the last two decades, during the past three years, the 'Friends of Hopital Justinien' organization, operated as a separate entity, has helped rebuild the Obstetrics-Gynecology sections and upgrade some existing services with new materials.

Supporting Hopital Justinien is particularly important for Dr. Jean-Baptiste L. Charlot, who interned at this public health facility as a young resident physician after graduating from Faculté de Médecine et de Pharmacie (Faculty of Medicine and Pharmacy) in Port-au-Prince in the early 70's. With other healthcare professionals based in South Florida, some of them with Haitian roots as well, including Dr. Michel J. Dodard, MD, and Dr. André Vulcain, MD, Dr. Charlot joined forces to get more people interested and involved in this social activity for the benefit of the Haitians who need care. Radio personalities Alex Saint-Surin and Jacques Cassagnol from Radio Mega are among the board members.

The Haitian-born doctors (Charlot – Dodard – Vulcain) volunteered with the UM-MSP Haiti Project and decided to start this charitable foundation so they could provide care for Haitians who require care. For the past three years, the organization has helped Hopital Justinien by providing important medical tools and material, not only to facilitate the work of local physicians, but also to make their journey less stressful and provide a better environment.

The fundraising event

It was an invitation-only fundraising event

that gathered about 100 donors. Board members, friends of the organization, and some significant local supporters, among others, were in attendance.

Dr. Michel Dodard, MD, welcomed the guests with an opening remark that set a wonderful and positive tone for the event. The organization's board secretary and Director of Haiti Project/Family Medicine Program, expressed gratitude by thanking the gracious hosts who opened their North Miami residence to support the private fundraiser. Pleased to see so many friends show up at the event, he highlighted the importance of the gathering for this charitable cause before introducing his colleague, Dr. André Vulcain, MD who lead a 35 minute presentation, which provided the guests a great learning opportunity about the Haiti Project in Hopital Justinien.

Dr. Vulcain elaborated on the various aspects of the Haitian family doctors program over the past two decades.

Based on the main presentation, the three year academic training program (modeled on the U.S. standards for Family Medicine) has been a great success. All trainings take place at the Family Practice Center and other clinical departments of Hopital Justinien. Sometimes the participants are rotated to external facilities. As of 2019, the program has graduated 70 family doctors and 10 residents are currently in training. Most importantly, as Dr. Vulcain noted, is the fact that over 84% of the graduates are practicing in Haiti and at least 7 of them are at the highest administrative levels in different departments throughout the country.

"The educational training program gives credence for what we call building capacity," said Dr. Vulcain who shares his time between Miami and Haiti. "These doctors can serve in their community. These doctors can ultimately contribute in transforming the reality of the health care system."

In a picture taken 15 years ago shown during the presentation, Dr. Vulcain pointed out three former family medicine residents who are now in charge at some of the highest positions within the Haitian Healthcare system, including Dr. Gerard (Director of the residency program in Cap-Haitien), with the Haiti Projects program that he and other physician colleagues helped to create; Dr. Kerline Israel who established an extension of the Haiti Project Family Program in Saint-Marc (her native city in the Artibonite Department); and Dr. Destiné who is the Director of that second program, just to name a few.

Excellence for HIV/AIDS Care received about 8,000 HIV patients between 2005 and 2019. Between 2001 and 2017, 4,000 pregnant women were seen at the Center of Excellence.

Some of the Haiti Project Haitian family doctors program's major accomplishments include starting up physical rehabilitation, training HIV nurse practitioners (between 2014 and 2016), and primary care mental health training (between 2012 and 2013). The numerous contributions this program made were remarkable during the earthquake aftermath of 2010 and the cholera epidemic between 2010 and 2011.

Dr. Vulcain also covered some of the challenges Haiti Project is still facing, such as maintaining the quality of the academic program and adjusting it to meet the needs of the Haitian people (preceptorship), continuing to address the needs of the patients through the delivery of comprehensive services at the FPC (chronic diseases), and most importantly, generating the resources necessary to accomplish them.

Among the many funders of the program during the last two decades are Open Society Institute, Medishare, USAID(HIV), CDC (HIV), AMHE, and some amazing private donors.

The physician whose specialties include Family Medicine also showed gratitude during his presentation, naming many institutions based in United States that have been very supportive to the project. He went on to mention the UM Dept. of Family Medicine (1999 to 2018), UM Division of Infectious Diseases, UM School of Nursing (2012), UM Dept. of Pediatrics(2017), AAFP Foundation (2014 2018), Mobility Outreach (2011-2014), Rotary Club Dadeland (2014), and Burns Advocates (2011).

At the conclusion of his presentation, attendees congratulated members of the 'Friends of Hopital Justinien Project Haiti' organization for their passion and commitment to continue helping the northern population of Haiti in the health care sector. Dr. Arthur Fournier, one of the founders of the Haiti Project, who could not attend the event, addressed the audience over the phone.

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
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40 Days: A Festival of the Word, Healings, Deliverance ...

The sixth edition of the 40 Days of Fasting of Tabernacle of Glory took place from June 23 to August 4 in Miami. 



Men Can't Avoid Enlargement of the Prostate (BPH) as they Get Older





BPH is an enlarged prostate. The prostate goes through two main growth cycles during a man's life. The first occurs early in puberty, when the prostate doubles in size. The second phase of growth starts around age 25 and goes on for most of the rest of a man's life. BPH most often occurs during this second growth phase.

As the prostate enlarges, it presses against the urethra and may cause urinary symptoms. The bladder wall becomes thicker. One day, the bladder may weaken and lose the ability to empty fully, leaving some urine behind in the bladder. Narrowing of the urethra by BPH can lead to complete urinary retention – Complete urinary retention is a medical emergency which needs to be treated within a few hours. Otherwise the kidneys may fail and severe urinary tract infection associated with sepsis can develop. This can lead to death. Symptomatic BPH is a serious medical condition which should not be ignored.

BPH is benign in most cases. This means it is not cancer. Contrary to popular belief, it does not cause or lead to cancer. However, BPH and cancer can happen at the same time in the same prostate.

BPH is common. About half of all men between ages 51 and 60 have BPH. Up to 90% of men over age 80 have it. In essence, most men can't avoid enlargement of the prostate as they get older.



What is the Prostate

The prostate is part of the male reproductive system. It is about the size of a walnut and weighs about an ounce. The prostate is found below the bladder and in front of the rectum. It goes all the way around a tube called the urethra, which carries urine from the bladder out through the penis.

The prostate's main job is to make fluid for semen. During ejaculation, sperm made in the testicles moves to the urethra. At the same time, fluid from the prostate and the seminal vesicles also moves into the urethra. This mixture – semen – goes through the urethra and out through the penis.

When the prostate is enlarged, it can bother or block the bladder. Needing to urinate often is a common symptom of BPH. This might be every 1 to 2 hours, mainly at night.

Other symptoms include:

- Feeling that the bladder is full, even right after urinating
- Feeling that urinating "can't wait"
- A weak flow of urine
- Needing to stop and start urinating several times
- Trouble starting to urinate
- Trouble starting to urinate
- Needing to push or strain to urinate

If BPH becomes severe, you might not be able to urinate at all. This is an emergency that must be treated right away.

If you start having any of the symptoms noted above, Go see your doctor or healthcare provider.

Treatment options may include oral medications, minimally invasive surgery like (Urolift) or TURP with or without laser.

Dr. Michel Dodard, who directed the program, expressed great satisfaction in helping others. He noted that the Family Medicine residency has raised the level and quality of medical services and has been used as a launching platform for several other clinical services and training programs benefiting the entire local health system in Haiti.

According to Dr. Dodard, continual funding challenges and uncertain sustainability remain potential threats to the growth and expansion of the Haiti Project. There is still a need to continue training in family medicine in Haiti. There is still an urgency to learn and process all the elements of family medicine. There is also remains an urgent need to secure funding for the present training program and an ever present need to extend its model to serve a larger demographic.

While the non-profit organization is a separate entity, the August 17th fundraiser was a way to keep the program alive, continue implementing educational and health care services in Hopital Justinien since the Center for Disease Control (CDC), an important financial partner, suspended its grant contribution to the program 18 months ago. La Police Nationale d'Haïti change de chef

Gédéon quitte la direction de l'institution avec un bilan mitigé

Pourtant, lors de son affectation il y'a 3 ans à la tête de la PNH, M. Gédéon avait suscité beaucoup d'espoir, autant chez la population que dans les rangs de la police qui espéraient voir leurs conditions de travail s'améliorer. M. Gédéon est en effet un pur produit de cette institution qu'il connaît comme sa poche puisqu'il y a effectué l'essentiel de sa carrière. On pensait donc, au vu de son pedigree, qu'il était l'homme qui allait enfin régler le problème de l'insécurité dans le pays. Malheureusement pour lui, les résultats sur le terrain sonnent comme un cuisant échec.

La situation n'a fait qu'empirer année après année depuis sa nomination en avril 2016 en remplacement de Godson Orélus. La population n'a pas constaté d'améliorations palpables sur le plan sécuritaire, puisque les malfrats continuent de faire la loi dans les rues, semant la terreur autour d'eux de nuit comme de jour. La police ne fait plus peur à personne, surtout que depuis quelque temps, on constate que les gangs sont beaucoup mieux équipés. La contrebande et les trafics facilités par la porosité de nos frontières ont permis à nombre de bandes organisées de mettre la main sur des armes sophistiquées et un matériel de guerre dernier cri. Cela a engendré un déséquilibre des rapports de force que la population ressent quotidiennement sur le terrain. Les quartiers où la police n'ose même plus mettre les pieds se comptent désormais par centaines. Sous-équipés, sous-payés et souvent en sous-nombres, nos agents n'entendent pas risquer leur vie et s'aventurer dans des endroits où des guets-apens mortels les attendent. C'est ainsi qu'on a vu émerger des zones de non-droit où ce sont les criminels qui font la loi.

Dans un discours prononcé le 8 août dernier lors de la cérémonie de graduation de la 30ème promotion de la Police nationale, Gédéon reconnaissait d'ailleurs lui-même de manière implicite que le seuil critique avait été atteint. Les criminels ont pris l'ascendant sur les forces de l'ordre dans plusieurs régions du pays. Certains secteurs traînent désormais une funeste réputation de quartiers coupe-gorge comme Cité l'Éternel, Village de Dieu, Grand-Ravine ou encore Ti Bwa. Difficile dans ce cas de s'enorgueillir d'un bilan positif lorsque les citoyens vivent la peur au ventre et sont constamment sur leurs gardes chaque fois qu'ils mettent les pieds dehors. Si Gédéon peut se targuer d'avoir dans son tableau de chasse le caïd Arnel Joseph qui a été mis aux arrêts dans des conditions rocambolesques, ce n'est là que l'arbre qui cache la forêt. Globalement, le bilan de Gédéon est médiocre à tous les niveaux, pour le plus grand malheur des Haïtiennes et des Haïtiens confrontés au quotidien à un taux de criminalité qui bat des records.

Remplacement de Gédéon, un timing plus que suspect

Jovenel Moïse est en train de quadriller méthodiquement l'échiquier politique, mais aussi militaire du pays. Il estime donc que Gédéon a fait son temps et que ses compétences ne sont plus adaptées aux besoins d'un département qui exige beaucoup de rigueur, d'engagement... et de docilité vis-à-vis du Président de la République. Car tout le monde sait que les relations entre les deux hommes n'étaient pas au beau fixe depuis un certain temps. Le lendemain de l'arrestation d'Arnel Joseph, Gédéon a déclaré sans ambages devant les micros des médias que si le chef de gang se met à table et commence à divulguer les noms de ses soutiens, cela pourrait engendrer un véritable séisme dans le monde politique. Certains y voyaient une menace à peine voilée à l'encontre de l'entourage de Moïse. Un peu comme Edgar Hoover à son époque qui faisait subtilement chanter les Présidents américains successifs pour qu'ils le gardent à la tête du FBI.

Notons tout de même que le timing de ce changement à la PNH tombe assez mal dans la mesure où la situation politique est plus que jamais instable. Pourquoi choisir de remplacer le directeur de la PNH maintenant, alors que le pays est sans gouvernement légitime depuis des mois ? À un moment où le parlement continue à tergiverser et ne semble pas pressé de donner son feu vert au Premier Ministre nommé Fritz-William Michel pour former son équipe, l'empressement du chef de l'État à remplacer l'encombrant Gédéon n'est pas anodin et nous fait nous poser pas mal de questions.

Tout cela laisse à penser que la substitution du chef de la police est un choix politique plus que sécuritaire. Les voix du pouvoir étant impénétrables, on se contentera donc des déclarations officielles qui proclament un changement... dans la continuité. La cérémonie de passation de pouvoir orchestrée par le Premier ministre démissionnaire se voulait solennelle. M. Michel Lapin a égrené les formules d'usage en remerciant l'ex-chef de la Police pour le travail accompli durant les 3 dernières années. Gédéon, droit dans ses bottes et vêtu d'un treillis militaire, avait du mal à cacher son amertume malgré un sourire de façade. Il n'a d'ailleurs pas raté l'occasion,

lorsque M. Lapin lui a tendu le micro, de décocher quelques flèches à peine voilées envers ses ennemies qu'il tient sans doute pour responsable de son 'éviction constitutionnelle'. Cela montre clairement que l'ex-chef de la Police espérait rempiler pour 3 années supplémentaires et ne s'attendait sûrement pas à un remplacement aussi prématuré, même si son premier mandat arrivait à terme.

Et les mots lancés par Gédéon étaient bien choisis et ne laissaient aucune place au doute quant à sa déception. Ainsi, pour lui, c'est "par la force des choses" qu'il a dû tirer sa révérence. Dans le chapitre des remerciements, il a tenu à rendre hommage à ses camarades de promotion, à ses frères, ainsi qu'à ses collaborateurs fidèles "qu'il pourrait compter sur les doigts de la main". Il a aussi tenu à saluer les moins fidèles et les envieux qui lui ont appris une nouvelle dimension de l'ingratitude humaine, ainsi que les détracteurs et les traîtres qui lui ont permis de gagner en expérience et en maturité et qui lui ont été utiles à leur manière. "Traîtres", le mot est lâché. Dans la salle, tout le monde comprend que Gédéon ne digère toujours pas son remplacement qu'il met sur le dos des renégats qui travaillent dans l'ombre contre lui.

Rameau va-t-il réussir là où tous ses prédécesseurs ont échoué ?

Lorsqu'il a appris la nouvelle de sa nouvelle nomination, Normil Rameau était

encore en poste à l'ambassade d'Haïti à Washington d'où il a dû rentrer précipitamment. Avant sa mutation à la capitale fédérale américaine, Rameau était le second de Gédéon en tant que chef de la direction centrale de la Police Judiciaire. C'est dire les deux hommes se connaissent assez bien. Rameau ne débarque donc pas dans un terrain qui lui est inconnu, loin de là. Mais la tâche qui l'attend s'annonce particulièrement périlleuse, à un moment où les agents de la PNH manquent cruellement de moyens humains et matériels pour mener à bien leur mission qui consiste à 'protéger et servir' le peuple haïtien.

Le moral des policiers est actuellement au plus bas, se sentant abandonnés par un état qui ne tient pas ses engagements. Face à ce manque de motivation légitime, Rameau aura la lourde tâche de regonfler la confiance de ses troupes en attendant que le gouvernement tienne enfin ses promesses. Sur le terrain, la situation est peu reluisante, chaque jour apportant son lot de crimes toujours plus violents. Jeudi dernier par exemple, au niveau de Martissant et du Bicentenaire, des coups de feu nourris ont été entendus par les habitants qui se retrouvent souvent piégés au milieu de tirs croisés entre bandes rivales, lorsqu'ils ne sont pas eux-mêmes visés par les criminels. C'est ainsi qu'une mère de famille a été tuée la veille sous les yeux horrifiés de sa fille en sortant d'une banque, alors que quelques heures plus tôt, c'est un pauvre sapeur-pompier qui a vu sa vie s'arrêter brutalement au bord du camion qu'il conduisait, victime lui aussi de tueurs que rien ne semble pouvoir arrêter. Durant les 3 derniers mois, il y'a eu 84 morts par balles à Port-au-Prince selon un recensement officiel. Des chiffres qui font peur et font glisser peu à peu Haïti dans le classement des pays les plus dangereux au monde.

Pour revenir à la PNH, Moïse a théoriquement l'assurance jusqu'à la fin de son mandat de ne pas craindre grand-chose de la part du nouveau directeur fraîchement nommé par ses soins.

Les Grenadiers menacés de suspension : pourquoi cela n'arrive qu'à nous?

Les supporters des Grenadiers ne sont toujours pas descendus de leur nuage. Les passionnés de football et les inconditionnels de l'équipe nationale continuent de débattre sur cette équipe talentueuse qui nous a tant émerveillés lors de la dernière Gold Cup édition 2019. Nos valeureux guerriers étaient en effet à un cheveu d'une qualification historique en finale, n'eût été la décision controversée de l'arbitre Qatari Al-Jassim d'accorder un pénalty litigieux aux Mexicains dans le temps additionnel. Alors qu'on attendait tous de la Fédération haïtienne de Football de capitaliser sur cette performance héroïque pour faire passer nos Grenadiers à une étape supérieure, ses dirigeants nous ont concocté un tout autre plan qui risque de nous faire tomber de haut !

Que réclame exactement la FIFA à la Fédération haïtienne de Football (FHF) ?

Lorsque l'instance dirigeante du football mondial lance un avertissement à la fédération nationale d'un pays, il vaut mieux ne pas le prendre à la légère. Depuis que l'Italien Gianni Infantino a pris les rênes de la FIFA en 2016, il a promis de débarrasser le football mondial de la corruption et de la mauvaise gestion qui ont entaché le dernier mandat de son prédécesseur Sept Blatter. Chaque fédération doit ainsi respecter un cahier de charges bien précis, sous peine de subir de lourdes sanctions qui peuvent aller jusqu'à l'exclusion pure et simple de l'équipe nationale de toute compétition internationale. La FIFA se montre particulièrement sévère lorsqu'elle constate deux manquements en particulier : l'ingérence politique dans les affaires d'une fédération nationale, et la mauvaise gestion budgétaire.

Or aujourd'hui, la Fédération haïtienne de Football est dans le collimateur de la FIFA qui vient de lui adresser un avertissement clair. De quoi s'agit-il exactement ? Du paiement d'arriérés que la Fédération haïtienne doit à Patrice Neveu, un entraîneur français qui a dirigé les Grenadiers en 2015 et 2016. Si le bilan de Neveu à la tête des Grenadiers a été très décevant, avec pour seule performance une qualification à la Copa

Amérique ponctuée de 3 défaites en autant de matchs (12 buts contre et 1 seul pour), l'entraîneur n'entendait pas pour autant faire une croix sur ses émoluments. Le divorce étant une opération périlleuse qui laisse toujours des séquelles, celui de Neveu avec la FHF laissera à cette dernière une ardoise de 200.000\$ (pénalités comprises). Et la Fédération haïtienne de Football n'aura d'autres choix que de payer sous peine de se voir infliger de lourdes sanctions. La date butoir ayant été fixée au 31 août.

L'avenir des Grenadiers en suspens...

Dans le domaine du football, pour attirer un bon entraîneur, il faut y mettre le prix. Le monde du ballon rond connaît depuis quelques années une inflation sans limites. Un coach bien coté sur le marché coûte généralement plus de 1 million de dollars par année. À titre d'exemple, Jude Löw, l'entraîneur de la Mannschaft championne du Monde en 2014, touche un salaire annuel de 4 millions de \$, en plus des primes. Bien entendu, l'équipe d'Haïti ne joue pas dans la même catégorie, mais cela donne tout de même une idée plus précise sur la tendance globale d'un marché hautement concurrentiel.

Il faut également savoir que chaque entraîneur négocie soigneusement son contrat avant de s'engager

avec une équipe nationale afin de se protéger en cas de mauvais résultats. Ainsi, chaque entraîneur prend soin de faire signer une clause libératoire qui oblige la fédération à lui verser une certaine somme en cas de licenciement avant la fin de son contrat. Une sorte d'indemnité de départ. Cela peut sembler choquant pour les non-initiés, mais il ne faut pas oublier que le poste d'entraîneur est un métier à risque particulièrement vulnérable. Les coachs d'équipes nationales qui restent au-delà de 5 ans se comptent sur les doigts de la main.

Pour revenir au cas haïtien, il semblerait que le conflit opposant la FHF à Neveu ne souffre d'aucune contestation possible. Non seulement la FIFA a rendu son verdict en faveur de l'entraîneur français, mais même les dirigeants haïtiens n'ont pas protesté (au moment où nous écrivons cet article) contre le jugement, sachant apparemment qu'ils sont en tort. Reste maintenant à trouver l'argent ! Et à voir les gesticulations des responsables haïtiens ces derniers jours, tout porte à croire que les caisses de la fédération sont vides. Les dirigeants du football haïtien se seraient bien passés de cette mise en demeure de la FIFA qui les met dans l'embarras. Car maintenant, tous les projecteurs seront braqués sur eux, et tout le monde saura que la FIFA leur verse annuellement une subvention d'un million de dollars, à laquelle s'ajoutent 500.000\$ pour le

financement de projets liés au football. Où est donc passé tout cet argent ? Pourquoi la FHF n'a pas budgétisé le salaire de l'entraîneur alors qu'elle sait à l'avance combien elle devra lui verser ?

Le président de la FHF, Yves Jean-Bart, alias Dadou, devra trouver une solution et vite, avant que le couperet de la FIFA ne tombe. Si jamais les Grenadiers sont suspendus, ce ne sera pas seulement l'équipe dirigeante de la FHF qui en fera les frais, mais toute la classe politique. Haïti possède en ce moment une génération dorée constituée de joueurs pétris de talent. Le pouvoir a tout intérêt à ne pas briser le rêve de tout un peuple porté par son équipe nationale de football.

Un calendrier à venir chargé pour les Grenadiers

Alors que les Nazon et compagnie sont censés préparer sereinement les prochaines compétitions, les voilà avec une épée de Damoclès au-dessus de leur tête pour des histoires d'argent qui les dépassent. Les Grenadiers ont 2 matchs cruciaux à disputer au mois de septembre pour le compte de la Nations League de la Concacaf. Une confrontation aller-retour face à Curaçao qui aura lieu le 8 et le 11 septembre prochain. Puis le mois d'après, Haïti devra se mesurer au Costa Rica, un adversaire coriace qui aura à cœur de prendre sa revanche après sa dernière défaite 2-1 lors de la Gold Cup.

Espérons que le coach Marc Collat saura focaliser la concentration de ses troupes sur la préparation. Nos Grenadiers ne doivent pas se laisser distraire par des problèmes dont ils ne sont pas responsables, même s'ils seront en première ligne en cas de sanctions de la FIFA. Cette mésaventure ressemble étrangement à la situation à laquelle est confronté le peuple haïtien vis-à-vis de ses dirigeants. Un peuple courageux et ambitieux qui n'aspire qu'à réussir, mais qui malheureusement, est entravé dans son élan par une minorité qui ne sait faire qu'une chose : casser le rêve des autres.

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Le policier Sergo Guersaint condamné à perpétuité pour viol sur sa fille



Sergo Guersaint, un ex-agent de l'Unité de la sécurité générale du palais national

(USGPN), a été condamné ce mardi 27 août 2019, aux travaux forcés à perpétuité, a appris la rédaction de Loop Haiti. Guersaint avait avoué lors de son audition, le 13 août dernier, avoir couché avec sa fille... et pas qu'une fois.

C'est la fin d'une affaire ayant duré plus de trois ans et marqué beaucoup d'esprits. L'ancien policier et membre de l'Unité de la sécurité générale du palais national (USGPN), Sergo Guersaint, accusé d'avoir violé sa propre fille mineure, a connu son sort aujourd'hui. Reconnu coupable de viol "avec circonstances aggravantes", le concerné passera le restant de ses jours derrière les barreaux, nous a confirmé cet après-midi Marc-Guerson

Philistin, journaliste à radio Caraïbes.

Le scandale a éclaté en juillet 2016. Sergot Guersaint qui abusait sexuellement de sa fille de 13 ans, a été dénoncé par cette dernière. Après s'être enfuie d'un hôtel situé à Carrefour Rita, la victime a porté plainte à la Direction centrale de la police judiciaire (DCPJ) qui a procédé par la suite à l'arrestation de l'homme en question.

Trois ans plus tard, l'accusé a comparu devant le tribunal pour répondre de son forfait. Il a été entendu mardi 13 août par le tribunal criminel siégeant sans assistance de jury. À la demande du ministère public, il a été fait l'appel à l'un des enquêteurs de la DCPJ afin de retracer les moments de l'enquête de la police judiciaire sur le dossier. Le policier Jacques Ebens Jeudy a répondu à l'appel du tribunal. La DCPJ, après son investigation a dressé trois rapports sur cette affaire, indiquant que la Brigade de protection des mineurs a été instruite de porter secours à la mineure en danger.

Guersaint avait, lors de cette audition le 13 août, avoué avoir eu des rapports sexuels avec sa fille à maintes reprises. Toutefois, il indiquait avoir été manipulé par cette

dernière. « Elle avait son plan en tête. Moi, je cherchais à lui inculquer des notions de principe. Pourtant, elle m'a piégé. Si aujourd'hui, je suis par devant ce tribunal pour y être jugé pour crime de viol, c'est parce que j'ai voulu soutenir ma fille. Il y a sûrement une main cachée derrière ce qui m'est arrivé » avait-il raconté.

Pour Guersaint, répondant à une question du ministère public, ce n'est pas normal de coucher avec sa propre fille. Mais pour justifier son acte, il jetait la faute sur des étourdissements chroniques et récurrents qui, selon lui, lui font parfois perdre le contrôle. Au beau milieu du procès, il s'était jeté par terre en se tordant de douleurs au ventre. Ce qui avait contraint le juge de siège Jean Wilner Morin à suspendre l'audience programmée au 26 août.

L'audition n'avait pas pu reprendre comme prévu à cette date. L'état de santé de l'accusé en était la cause. Mais Guersaint s'est finalement présenté ce 27 août 2019 au tribunal où, en présence notamment de la mère de la fille, il a été déclaré coupable et condamné aux travaux forcés à perpétuité. Ce qui n'était pas le cas avec Gédéon que l'actuel Chef de l'État avait hérité de son prédécesseur Jocelme Privert. Gédéon commençait à avoir une liberté de ton qui ne plaisait pas du tout au Président de la République, notamment lorsqu'il affirmait que beaucoup de dirigeants politiques étaient de mèche avec des chefs de gangs notoire, leur facilitant entre autres l'introduction d'armes de poing dans le pays.

La marge de manœuvre du nouveau DG semble limitée à tous les niveaux. Aura-t-il les moyens pour lutter efficacement contre cette insécurité galopante ? A-t-il une réelle stratégie à mettre en œuvre ? Bénéficiera-t-il de tout l'appui nécessaire de la part

du gouvernement pour accomplir à bien sa mission ? Aura-t-il le soutien total de ses troupes qui sont plus démotivées que jamais ? Autant de défis qui attendent M. Rameau au cours de son nouveau mandat. Par ailleurs, Rameau aura certainement à conjuguer aussi avec l'inimitié de certains parlementaires qui feront tout pour lui mettre les bâtons dans les roues. Faut-il rappeler que lorsqu'il était à la tête de la Police Judiciaire, Rameau a mené des enquêtes qui ont mis en cause un certain nombre d'élus qui lui en veulent encore aujourd'hui. C'est d'ailleurs sous sa direction à la DCPJ que le sénateur Guy Philippe avait été arrêté avant d'être transféré aux États-Unis pour une affaire de drogue. Espérons que Rameau continuera à faire preuve de courage et d'abnégation lorsqu'il s'agira de mettre sous les verrous les

criminels de tous bords, même si beaucoup ne se font guère d'illusions, surtout lorsqu'on voit les moyens mis en œuvre pour lutter contre l'insécurité. Difficile de prédire qui sortira gagnant du match à trois entre les politiciens véreux, les gangs armés et Rameau. Par contre, on peut déjà deviner qui sera le grand perdant : le peuple haïtien !

Inde: Il veut une Jaguar mais ses parents lui offrent une BMW, il la jette dans la rivière



Il s'est vraiment montré ingrat. Les parents d'un Indien de 22 ans pensaient avoir trouvé le cadeau d'anniversaire idéal pour leur fils : une BMW M3 blanche toute neuve, d'une valeur de 3,5 millions de roupies (environ 44.000 euros). Mais la voiture de sport n'a visiblement pas été au goût du jeune homme, qui a préféré pousser le véhicule dans la rivière, rapporte la BBC, samedi 10 août.

Filmée par plusieurs témoins, cette scène peu

banale a été largement relayée sur les réseaux sociaux, où elle suscite de nombreux commentaires.

Selon la chaîne anglaise, le jeune homme aurait préféré que ses parents lui achètent une Jaguar, soit une dépense comprise entre 4 et 5 millions de roupies (entre 52.000 et 62.800 euros).

A-t-il regretté son geste ? C'est probable, puisqu'il a ensuite sauté dans la rivière pour tenter d'empêcher la voiture de sombrer. En vain. D'autres personnes sont alors montées dans un canot de sauvetage pour tenter de récupérer le véhicule à l'aide d'une corde, sans plus de succès. Selon plusieurs médias locaux, l'incident fait désormais l'objet d'une enquête de police.

Et cette année, il fallait trancher entre trois joueurs : Cristiano Ronaldo (Juventus), Lionel Messi (FC Barcelone) et enfin Virgil van Dijk (Liverpool). Auteur de six buts et deux passes décisives en neuf matches de C1 (dont un triplé contre l'Atlético), l'international portugais a bien aidé la Vieille Dame, qui s'est finalement arrêtée en quarts de finale face à l'Ajax Amsterdam. De son côté, la star argentine a fait trembler les filets. « La Pulga » a en effet terminé

meilleur buteur de cette édition avec 12 réalisations. Enfin, le défenseur néerlandais, impressionnant durant toute la saison, a lui écorché les attaquants adverses avec Liverpool pour remporter cette Ligue des Champions.

Finalement, c'est Virgil van Dijk qui a remporté le trophée de meilleur joueur UEFA de la saison 2018-2019, suc-

cédant ainsi à Luka Modric, sacré l'été dernier. Un sacre qui récompense donc le travail défensif du roc des Reds, également élu meilleur défenseur, qui a réagi après avoir reçu son trophée : « d'abord, je dois remercier tous mes coéquipiers. Sans eux, sans l'équipe, sans le staff, on n'aurait pas réussi tout ça. Je pense à ma famille évidemment. Cela a été un long chemin. Je ne

suis pas un jeune joueur, j'ai pris mon temps, j'ai profité de chaque étape. Je suis très fier d'obtenir ce trophée. Merci à tous ceux qui m'ont aidé. »

Les mercatos se suivent et ne se ressemblent pas pour Alexis Sanchez. À l'été 2017,

le Chilien était courtisé par plusieurs cadors européens à l'image du Paris Saint-Germain, qui avait finalement fait signer Neymar et Kylian Mbappé. Resté à Arsenal, l'attaquant souhaitait toujours s'en aller. Et à l'hiver 2018, Manchester City et Manchester United se livraient une bataille acharnée pour le recruter. Un combat remporté par les pensionnaires d'Old Trafford, qui se félicitaient d'avoir réussi à enrôler l'ancien joueur du FC Barcelone.

Mais tout ne s'est pas vraiment passé comme les deux parties l'espéraient. Que ce soit avec José Mourinho puis Ole Gunnar Solskjær, Alexis Sanchez n'a jamais vraiment réussi à convaincre

sous le maillot des Red Devils. À chaque mercato, son nom était d'ailleurs sorti du chapeau. La presse anglaise évoquait régulièrement un départ du footballeur âgé de 30 ans. Cela a été le cas cet été 2019. Alexis Sanchez a été lié à l'AS Roma durant un moment. Mais finalement, c'est un autre club de Serie A qui est parvenu à lui mettre le grappin dessus.

En effet, Manchester United vient d'annoncer le départ de l'international chilien à l'Inter. « Nous pouvons confirmer qu'Alexis Sanchez rejoint l'Inter Milan en prêt jusqu'au 30 juin 2020. Nous lui souhaitons bonne chance en Italie ». Après Romelu Lukaku, Antonio Conte et les Nerazzurri piochent donc une nouvelle fois à Manchester United. Alexis Sanchez, qui avait quitté l'Udinese et le Calcio en 2011, fait donc son grand retour en Italie sous forme de prêt sans option d'achat.

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Dossier Neymar : La réaction inattendue de Suarez depuis l'Uruguay

Depuis l'Uruguay, Luis Suarez s'est exprimé sur le cas Neymar. Si le vestiaire catalan pousse pour la signature, l'attaquant du Barça a invité le monde du football à laissé Neymar décidé tout seul.

Luis Suarez s'est entretenu avec le journaliste Diego Jokas de la radio uruguayenne Sport 890 sur diverses questions. Il a également répondu sur le cas Neymar. Lorsqu'il a évoqué ses dialogues avec le footballeur brésilien, il a déclaré qu'il avait parlé «à l'époque, mais pas maintenant. C'est une période difficile pour lui. Le club qui ne le quitte pas (en allusion claire au Paris Saint Germain). Vous

devez le laisser seul, de sorte qu'il décide le meilleur pour lui. Essayer de le voir heureux

».

Luis Suarez veut voir Neymar heureux, c'est probablement aux côtés de lui et Lionel Messi qu'il le sera. En effet, l'attaquant brésilien a toujours souligné son envie de ne venir qu'au Barça. Présentement, les négociations stagnent. La contre proposition du PSG n'a pas reçu une réponse affirmative du Barça.

Le FC Barcelone a analysé les demandes du club français, qui estimait Neymar à 215 millions d'euros. Ceci, dans le cadre d'une opération complexe incluant Dembélé, Rakitic et Todibo. Tout ceci se fera en plus

d'une somme importante. C'est ce que le PSG avait prévu de faire, une fois que Coutinho a rejoint en prêt le Bayern.

Le conseil d'administration du Barça a étudié la proposition du PSG et sa viabilité économique. Il a répondu négativement au club français. Avec cette réponse, les négociations sont rompues et l'arrivée de Neymar est pratiquement exclue. À l'exception d'un nouveau mouvement de dernière minute qui semble peu probable.

Après les derniers contacts entre les deux clubs, le conseil d'administration du Barça a dû analyser aujourd'hui la dernière proposition du PSG. Le club français se veut trop exigeant et inaccessible pour les Blaugranas. Il y a eu une réunion extraordinaire du dôme de Barcelone. La décision a été prise de répondre négativement à la contre-offre du PSG.

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
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
